too often an afterthought.

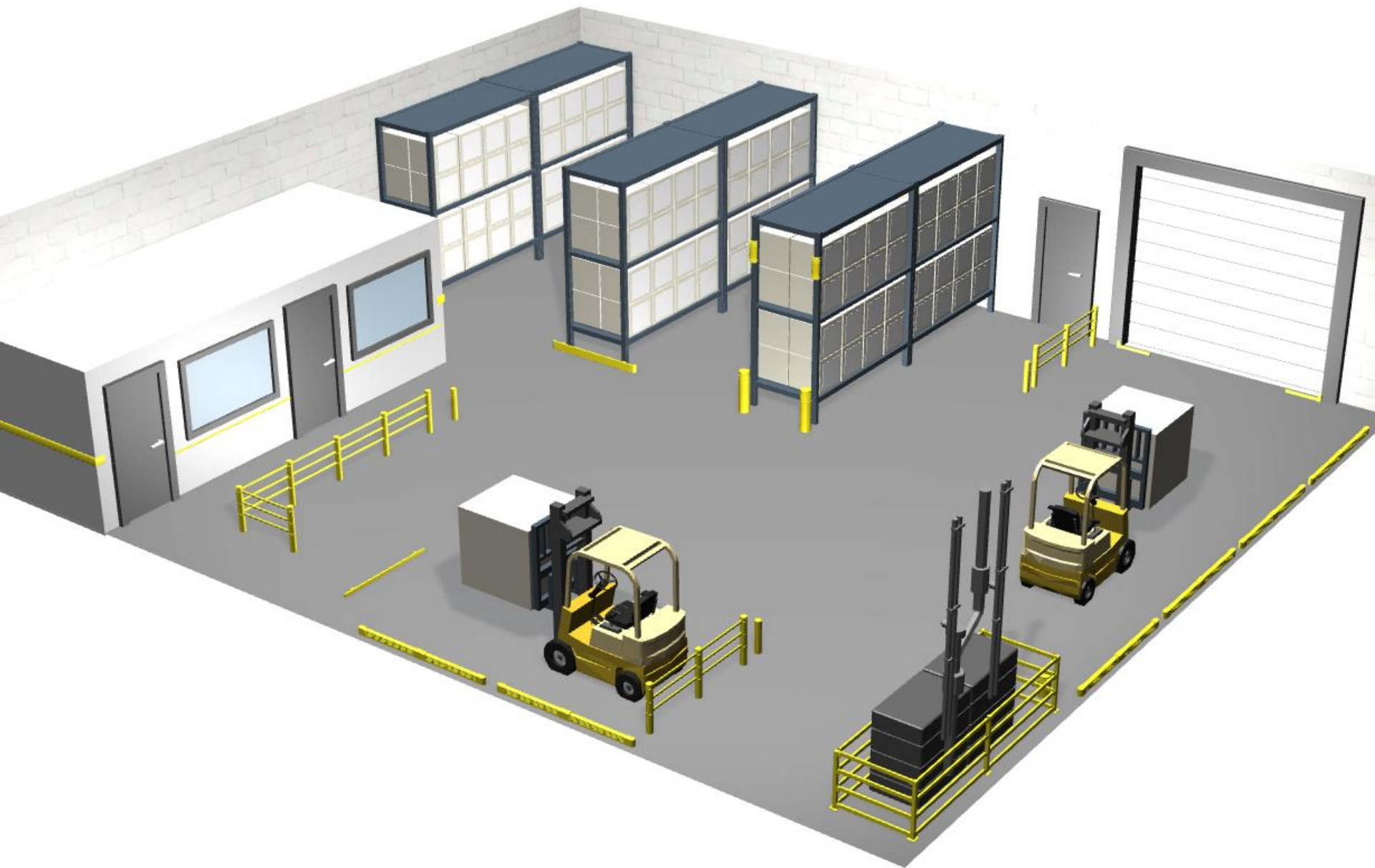














Last Line of Defense

Some Statistics

90,000 forklift accidents per year

Approx 35,000 injuries per year

Approx 85 fatalities per year

Avg 90% of forklifts will be in an accident during their useful life

Costs estimated > \$100m

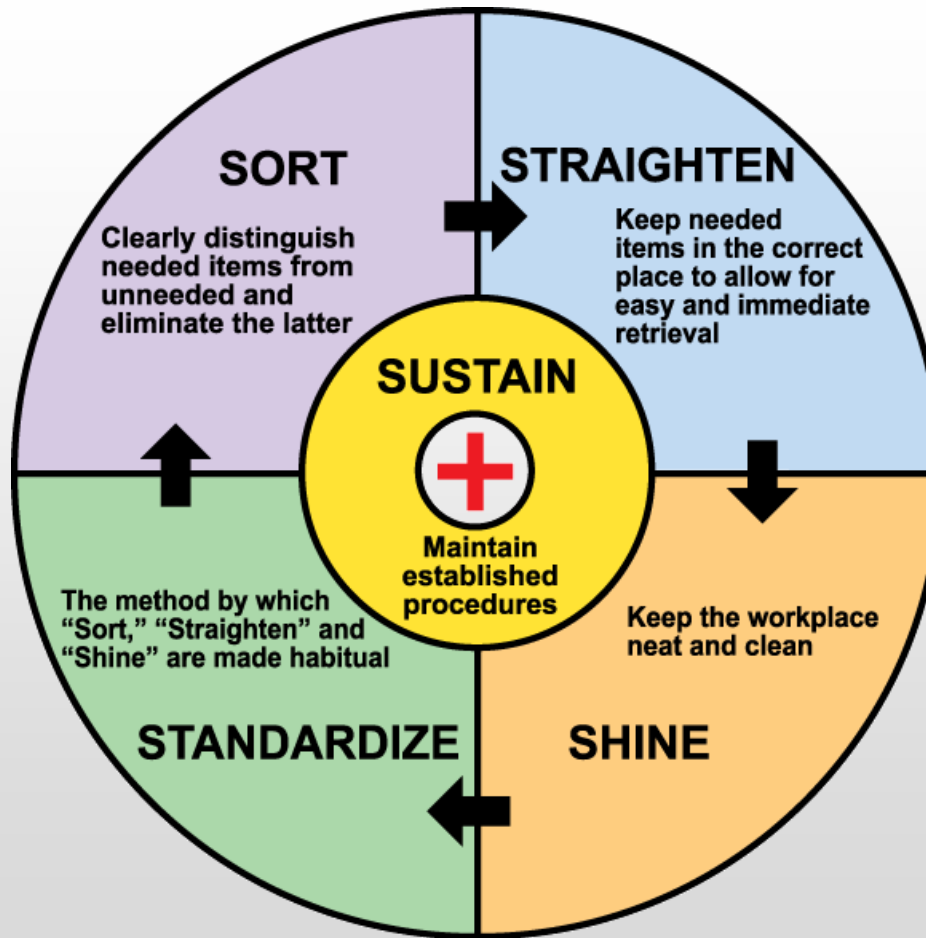

Plan your high-traffic damage areas like another layer in the blueprint.





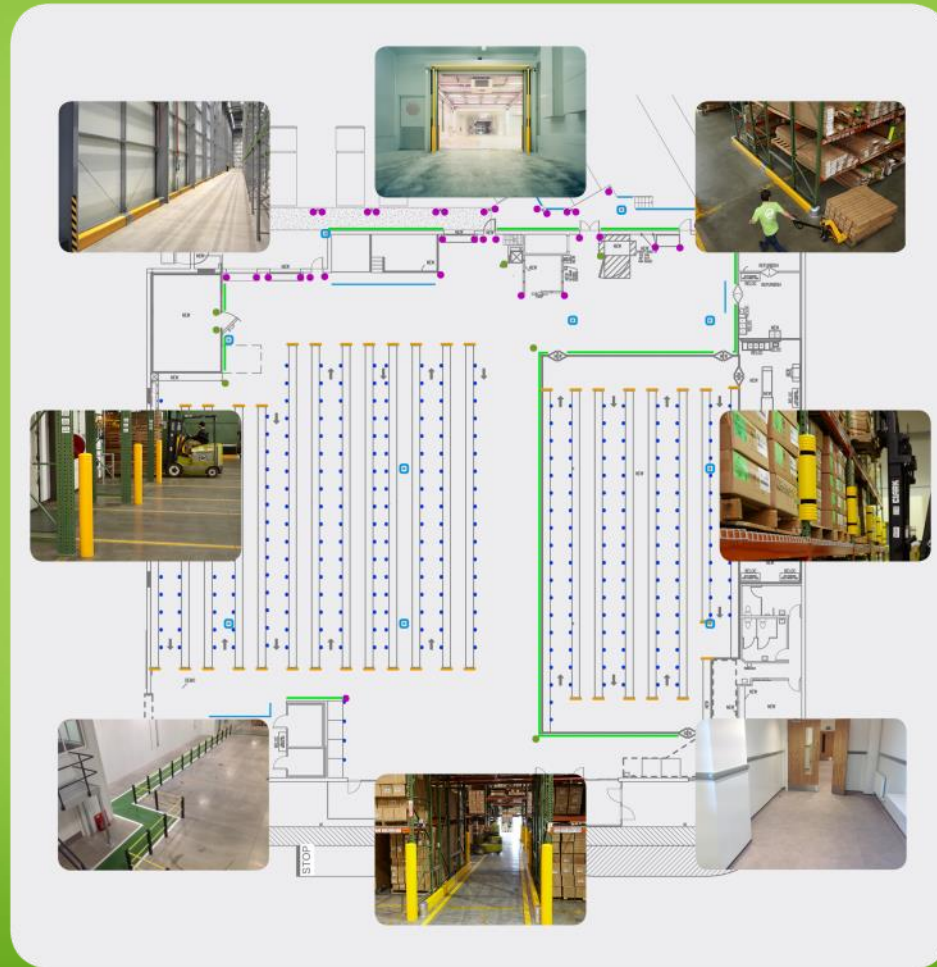








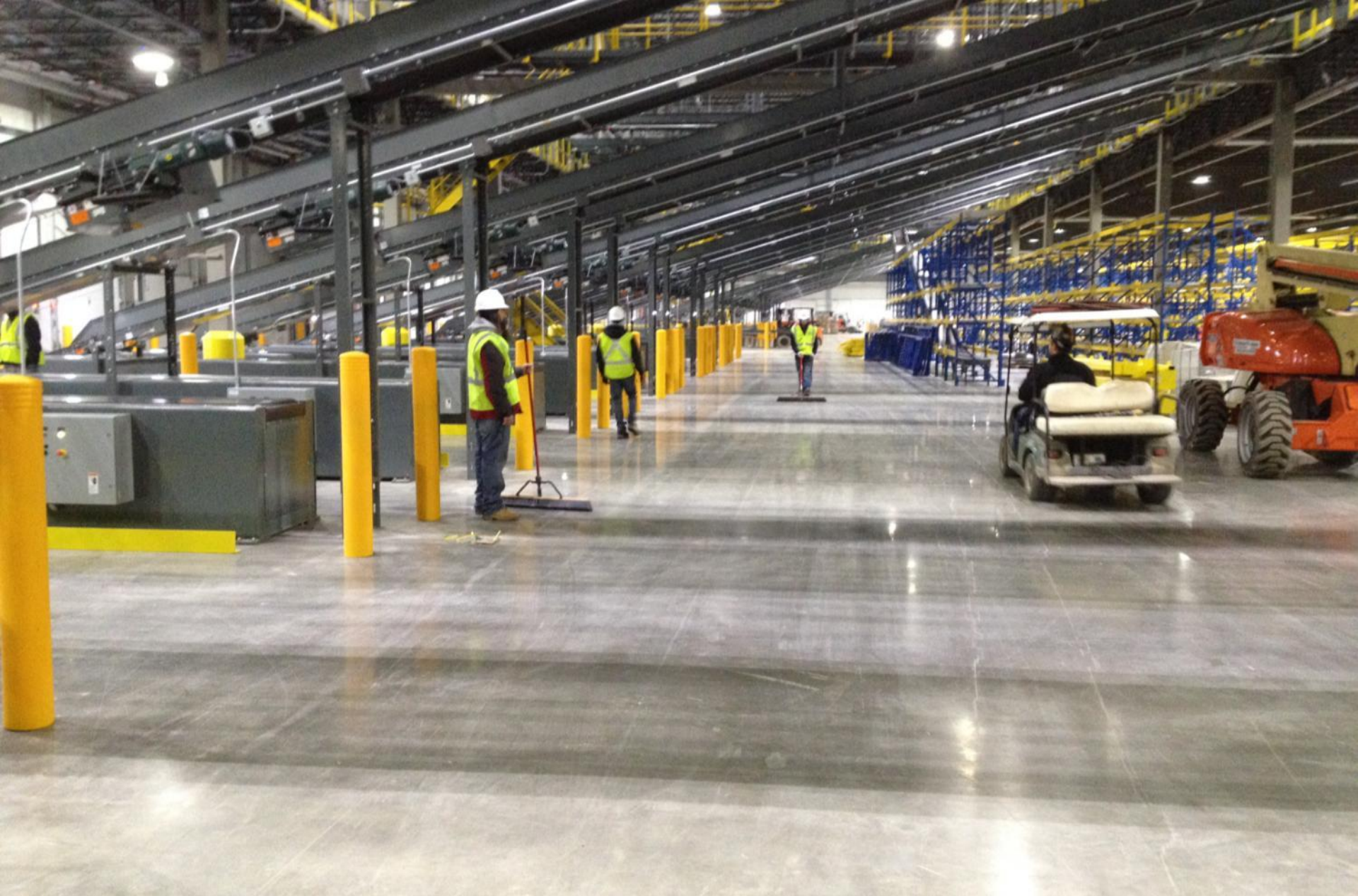

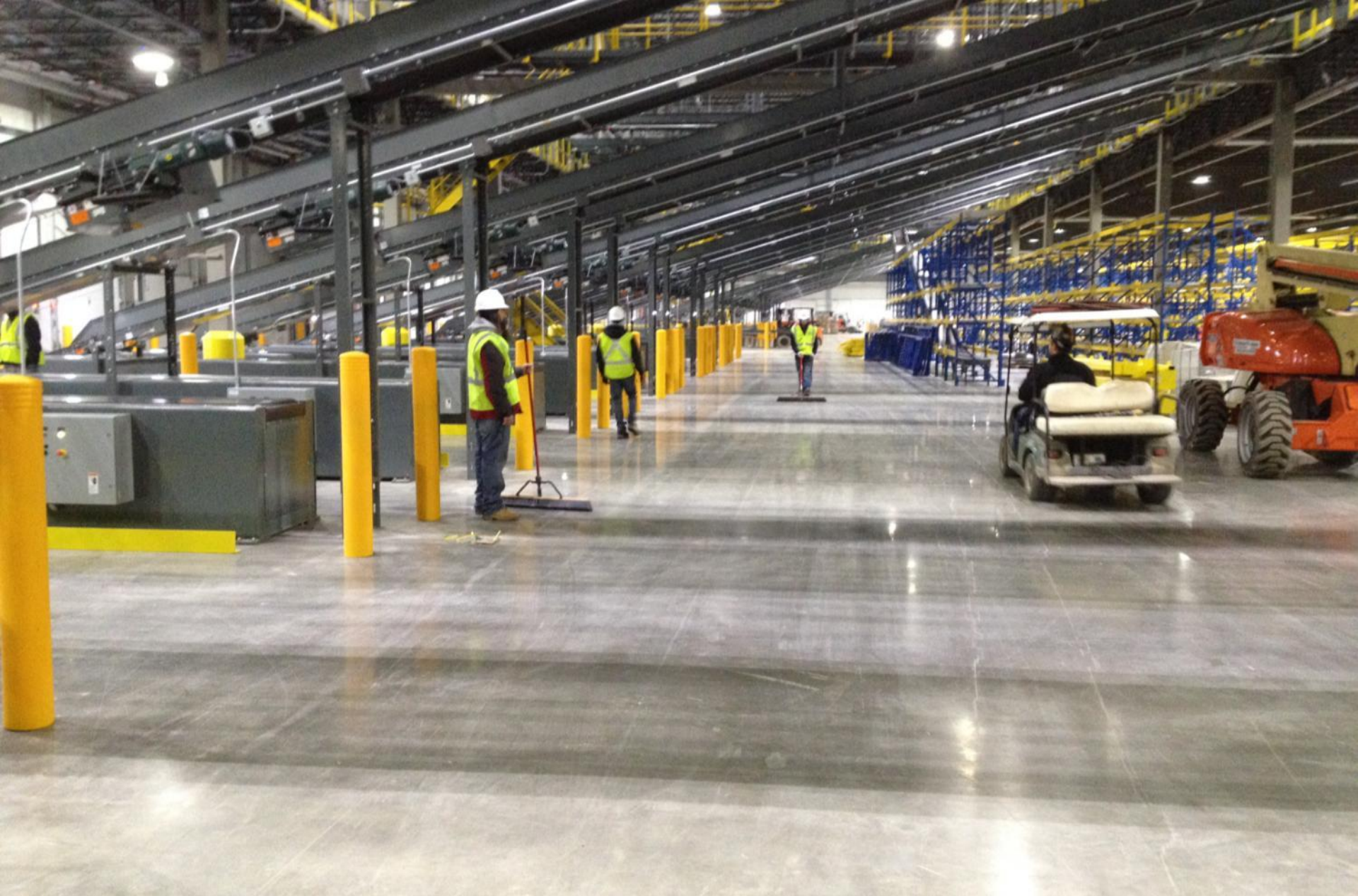
